Information Pack

Purpose

- To provide a forum for young people to highlight issues, needs and aspirations important to them and relevant to local government in Nillumbik Shire
- To build confidence, skills and knowledge in young people including leadership, community, team work and project management skills
- To provide advice, feedback and input, on behalf of young people in Nillumbik, into the development of Council strategies, policies, projects and decision making
- To provide a platform for young people to have a say and lead projects that impact their lives
- To initiative projects, events and activities that aim to support, empower and improve the lives of young people in Nillumbik
- To educate young people about local government and the role it plays in shaping the community

The Nillumbik Shire Council Youth Council will consist of up to fifteen (15) young people aged 15-25 years of age who are passionate about being involved in their community and representing the views, ideas and needs of young people in the Nillumbik area.

The Nillumbik Youth Council will:

- act as a peak advisory group to Council, advocating for opportunities, barriers and/or issues impacting on young people in Nillumbik
- Provide advice to Council about how these issues can be addressed
- Develop local initiatives and projects for young people

The Nillumbik Youth Council will be responsible for the establishment and review of a Youth Strategy and Action Plan, which will set out the priorities and actions for young people to lead with the support of Council across their two-year term.



Benefits of being a member of Youth Council

- Increase your confidence, skills and knowledge in leadership, advocacy, team work, local government, communication and project management
- Opportunity to provide feedback, advice and views on issues that are important to you and other young people in your community
- Build strong connections with other young people, local government and within your local community
- Learn key skills such as running and facilitating meetings, community engagement, developing and leading projects, advocacy and more
- Great experience to add to your CV!

Selection criteria

The Nillumbik Youth Council will consist of up to 15 Youth Councillors aged between 15-25 years of age, who live, work, volunteer, study or play in Nillumbik and will include the election of a Mayor and Deputy Mayor.

Term of Officer

- Youth Councillors will be appointed for a one year term, however all Youth Councillors reserve the right to reconsider their role on Youth Council each financial year according to work, study or personal commitments.
- The Mayor will be elected by a majority of the Youth Council and will stand for a period not exceeding one (1) year. The Youth Mayor is responsible for chairing the meetings of Youth Council.
- The Deputy Mayor will be elected by a majority of the Youth Council and will stand for a period not exceeding one (1) year. The deputy mayor will chair the meetings when the Youth Mayor is unavailable

Meetings

- At the beginning of their term, the Youth Council will be required to attend all induction and training meetings scheduled (to be determined by the Youth Development Team)
- The Youth Council will meet monthly to support the co-development, review and implementation of Council's Youth Strategy and Action Plan
- Formal Advisory Meetings will be held bi-monthly in Council Chambers on a Monday between 4pm – 6pm
- Additional hours involving evening, weekends and school holidays may be required at various stages.



- Youth Council may at times attend and present at Ordinary and Future Nillumbik Council Meetings.
- Meetings will be attended and supported by the Team Leader Youth Development and Coordinator Youth, Community & Place

Appointment of Youth Councilors

- Interested young people between the ages of 15 and 24 years must complete an online application form that will be available on the Nillumbik Youth Website
- 2. All submissions will be reviewed and shortlisted.
- 3. Shortlisted applicants will be invited to attend an interview
- 4. Where possible, 15 Youth Councillors will be selected to represent a diverse range of young people from Nillumbik and according to the Selection criteria
- 5. The successful applicants will receive a letter of offer to become a member of the Youth Council
- 6. Successful applications will be required to return a signed acceptance offer by a specified time
- Unsuccessful applicants will be advised and offered the opportunity to meet with a Youth Development Officer to explore other local opportunities for community engagement and skill development
- 8. Each appointed Youth Council member who is, or turns 18, before or during their term is required to complete a Working with Children Check. Members are to maintain their Working with Children Check at all times and submit evidence of such to Council.
- 9. The election of a Mayor and Deputy Mayor will take place as part of the first formal meeting of the Youth Council

Payment

Youth Advisory Councillors will be reimbursed for their time and out of pocket expenses through a payment of \$500 per year, paid in four instalments of \$125 per quarter and only when 80% attendance is met throughout the year.
